
Disciplinary Notices

A LOOK AT THE HISTORY BEHIND THE BOARD FOR REGISTRATION OF ARCHITECTS

The 1931 session of the legislature of the State of Alabama passed an Act to regulate the practice of architecture and to create a state board for registration of architects, with general control and supervision of such regulations. The Alabama State Board for Registration of Architects first board members were: Hugh Martin of Birmingham, Ben Price of Birmingham, Walter Ausfeld of

Montgomery, John Carey of Mobile and Dean Frederic Child Biggin of Alabama Polytechnic Institute in Auburn.

Over the years, the Board has grown from five members to six members who represent regional areas of the state. They are governor appointed and serve for four year terms. Since 1931, the board has had 19 chairmen and 8 board secretaries who have served:
